Program Updates

♦ Story Telling

Stories help to develop a child's imagination by introducing new ideas into their world. It encourages children to realise that they can and

should imagine anything they want. Story telling also introduces new vocabulary to children, boosts their reading and listening skills and pronunciations. Pictured: our social workers share stories with our children.



♦ Health:

Children are doing well health wise, they are always visited in homes to check on how they are doing as well as ensuring the sanitation and hygiene is proper where they stay. Our social workers follow up on health issues and children who are required to take chronic medication are encouraged to take



their tablets regularly and also to take enough fluids and nutritious food. Previsits are made in hospitals for the children given appointments.

♦ Art Therapy

Coloring is an easy form of art that can be used for therapeutic purposes. Getting children to color helps them to relax their minds because they get to meet their friends and it is interesting.



MIRYANTE'S GOAT PROJECT

For those unfamiliar with our organisation's mission, we are dedicated to helping one child and family at a time. To this end, Miryante Community Centre came up with a policy of goat rearing where a goat is given to each family within the program. Providing this animal helps children and families by generating supplementary income. Goats provide milk which can boost immunity of anyone drinking it. In addition, if taken care of well, goats can multiply. Their offspring can be used for increasing a flock, sold at market for additional money, or eaten for their nutritious and delicious meat. An animal like a goat offers a family stability, which is important to anyone within the family unit, including the children receiving services through Miryante Community Centre. We take this opportunity to thank our donors for the support towards this project. This is a wonderful effort that is leading to many happy families! In addition, we encourage others to consider donating to our animal purchase fund on the Miryante website. Often the purchase of a goat is affordable, and it continues to support a family for many years!

read story books, looked at photo albums with magazines, shared candy, and engaged in singing and dancing. They always feel excited whenever they meet with friends in the


community.
