Despite of a few and unavoidable challenges our children have continued to have a positive education experience that enrich them with a sharp focus on achieving their academic potential. Our social workers have done several visits throughout the term to the schools. Our children with the aim of tracking their academic performances, behaviors and also find out the challenges these children face while at school. We are pleased to inform you that the general discipline of our children has been good and there has been a great improvement in their performance compared to the previous term. BUYENDE UPDATE

Food is always given to them to take them through the month. Our Buyende children also enjoy a range of recreational activities which help keep their bodies healthy and their minds engaged. In particular, children enjoy shading, football and volleyball. Social workers lead the children in these activities and take the opportunity to converse with children about their health, their foster families, their school and more. These relationships are very important for our children.
