


Brenda's goat had triplets which is a very exciting moment for Brenda! This experience makes her proud and gives her financial success.

KABASINGUZI PATIENCE


Patience has been featured in the Miryante newsletter before, and she is still waiting for a sponsor!

◆ VISIT CAMPUS



We not only give children the studying materials needed for school, but our social workers also make follow-up meetings at school, they monitor their attendance, and they ensure that school fees are paid on time to prevent any disruption during study time. They also check their books to monitor their progress, interact with their class teachers to ensure that each kid is comfortable at school.
